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
Our new House System!

Take a look at the wonderful logos he has designed!





We aim for all our pupils to become fluent readers, who can fully comprehend a text and ultimately develop a lifelong love of reading and our staff are excellent advocates for this. Success in reading is achieved through immersing our pupils in our reading curriculum.



Whole class reading

Whole class reading lessons happen three times per week for KS2 and two times a week for pupils in KS1 and these lessons are based around a selection of high quality shared texts. During the lessons, our pupils develop their fluency and comprehension skills and are immersed in language rich vocabulary and are introduced to a range of different authors.

Story time

At Bushbury Lane Academy, we prioritise reading and ensure every child is read to every day during our shared story time. Children are exposed to quality, thought-provoking texts and are read to in an expressive, engaging way. Teachers breathe life into the words to captivate the children's interest and promote a love of reading.




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Reading spines

In addition to encouraging pupils to read often, we are also passionate about our pupils reading widely and subsequentially have introduced class reading spines. Class reading spines include a series of high quality texts, which vary in author and genre and feature an array of key themes. Pupils receive their new reading challenge cards at the start of every academic year and are challenged to read the selected books for their year group in addition to the banded books that match their reading ability. If pupils are successful in this challenge, they will have read 100 high quality texts by the time they leave us in Year 6.









Reading at home with your child is one of the most valuable activities you can do to support their learning and development. Regular reading not only strengthens literacy skills but also fosters imagination, curiosity, and a love for learning. It builds vocabulary, improves concentration, and enhances comprehension. We kindly remind parents that the expectation is for children to read daily, as this consistent practice is key to their progress. Please use your child's reading diary to capture their daily reading and any reflections on their progress. Together, we can nurture confident, enthusiastic readers!

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We are excited to announce that our Prostrike, fundraising event will be taking place on **Tuesday 8th October** during the school day! Attendance

We understand that some absences during the school year can not be helped, however, we find the need to stress to all our parents the importance of your child being at school every day if they are fit and well. Excelent attendance at school is crucial if your child is to achieve his/ her very best potential. We do not authorise absence during the school term, unless in exceptional circumstances or if sufficient medical evidence is provided. I would therefore seek your full support in aiming for your child to have 100% attendance during his/ her time at Bushbury Lane. Please be aware that we will be sending letters out to those families where we are concerned about attendance and will have our Education Welfare Officer involved.

Punctuality

We are thankful to those of our parents who get their children to school on time daily but are still concerned that some of our children are continuously arriving to school late every morning and need your support to help this improve.

In Year 1—6, we start the school day with our spelling programme. If your child misses the first 15 minutes of school daily, they will never have spelling delivered to them at Bushbury Lane. Your child **deserves** to access these lessons.

Could we remind parents to please make use of our car park, rather than parking in front of the school; and also to be considerate to pedestrians and other vehicles by keeping to a maximum speed of 5mph when driving in front of the school to and from the car park—thank you for helping to keep our children safe.
