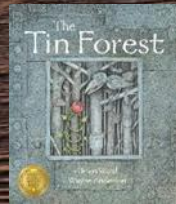


English

Short Stories

Pupils will learn how to write their own short stories using, features of a short story, use adverbs to show time and place. Use the full range of punctuation taught in previous year groups. Finishing with a final piece to show of the skills learnt.

We are reading...



Non-chronological reports

Pupils will learn how to write their own non-chronological report linking with our History topic 'through the ages'. The children will be looking at conjunctions and correct tense. This will then help them to write a report.

Reading

Pupils will be studying the book, 'The Tin Forest' written by Helen Ward during whole class reading lessons. During this time, children will develop their reading fluency through strategies such as echo reading and choral reading and will improve their ability to retrieve information from the text and make inferences based on evidence.

Maths

Numbers to 1000

Pupils will cover numbers up to 1000 and focuses on the value of each digit: place value. Pupils will learn how to compose and decompose numbers, compare, order and look for patterns.

Addition and subtraction

Pupils will cover starting off with simple addition before moving on to addition where renaming is required. Subtraction is also covered in a similar way where simple subtraction is mastered before moving to subtraction where renaming is required. Once pupils master addition and subtraction, they start to look at problem-solving questions and practice using bar models.

Art

Colour theory

This project teaches children about colour theory by studying the colour wheel and colour mixing. It includes an exploration of tertiary colours, warm and cool colours, complementary colours, analogous colours and how artists use colour in their artwork.



History

Through the ages

This project teaches children about British prehistory from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, including changes to people and lifestyle caused by ingenuity, invention and technological advancement.



Science

Animal Nutrition and the Skeletal System

This project teaches children about the importance of nutrition for humans and other animals. They learn about the role of a skeleton and muscles and identify animals with different types of skeleton.

Music

Music and technology

In this unit, pupils will listen, sing, play, improvise and compose with 20th century pop and soul music. Pupils will also explore the differences between live and digital music before developing their understanding of musical production.

Computing

Creating Media-

Pupils will use a range of techniques to create a stop-frame using tablets. Next, they will apply those skills to create a story-based animation. This unit will conclude with learners adding other types of media to their animation, such as music and text.
