At Bushbury Lane Academy, we understand the critical role that regular attendance plays in your child's education. Consistent attendance ensures that children receive the full range of learning opportunities, build important social skills, and make steady progress in all areas of their development. It's essential that children attend school on time every day, as missing school can affect their academic progress and their sense of belonging. We follow a clear process to monitor and improve attendance and punctuality, which can be seen in the flowchart below and is also available on our school website. Our goal is to support every child in achieving the best outcomes, and regular attendance is a key part of this. Thank you for your continued support in ensuring your child's success!

If your child has more than 3 lates per week...

A School Late letter is sent to raise awareness of school's increasing concern.

We believe you are on holiday...

Home visits have been made and it appears the family have gone on holiday, letter issued.

Going on an unauthorised holiday?

Complete a Permission to Request Leave letter, within 7 days a Holiday Penalty Notice Letter will be issued.

Attendance at Bushbury Lane Academy

Step 1: Attendance drops below 97%

Letter 1 - Initial Concern letter will be sent to parents. Offer of Early support.

Step 2: Attendance drops below 90%

Letter 2- Child is now considered to be persistently absent. Letter will be sent home to parents explaining that their child has now been put on a Persistent Absence chart that will be completed each day in school and their attendance will be closely monitored. When a child's attendance improves to 97%, a recognition letter will be sent home, and child will be removed for the PA chart.

Step 3: Little to no improvement made with multiple unauthorised absences. 10 sessions over a 10-week period have been missed.

Letter 3a- Notice to Improve (10 week notice period)

Parents will be invited in for an attendance meeting with school/and or educational welfare officer and an early support plan will be offered. Educational welfare officer is notified. If parent does not attend the meeting, a Did Not Attend letter is issues and a second meeting arranged. If no improvement is observed within a 10-week period, legal proceedings will start.

Step 3: Little to no improvement made (authorised absences)

Letter 3b – Increasing Concern

Child remains on PA list and attendance is closely monitored. An attendance action plan is made. If no improvement is made, escalated to Notice to Improve.

Step 4: Attendance continues to drop

Letter 4 – Serious Concern

Letter sent to issue warning that if attendance does not improve, a referral will be made for Statutory Attendance Support to the Local Authority.

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Step 5: No improvement

Referral made to the Local Authority attendance officer and an Attendance contract will be put in place. If not adhered to, fines will be issued.

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Anti-bullying week

This week, we will be marking Anti-Bullying Week within school, a national event that empowers children and teachers to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes.

We will be using anti-bullying week as an opportunity to reinforce the message that bullying is not acceptable. This is a topic we cover regularly in lessons and teachers hold discussions within the classroom about.

We will be providing opportunities for the children to consider what bullying is and what we can do to stop it. It is important that our children think about their friendships, words and actions carefully and understand the ways in which these are powerful in preventing bullying. Learning to understand and manage conflict is an important part of growing up. Bullying is not simply a 'falling out'. Research shows that experiencing bullying can have a significant impact on a child's life well into adulthood. To ensure we are able to prevent bullying and act quickly when it takes place it is important that we:

- Help children to understand the difference between falling out with friends, being a bit mean and signs that they might be experiencing bullying. Bullying is persistent, there's intent to cause harm and there's an abuse of power.
- Support children to grow in confidence, to make friends in a variety of settings and to take part in activities that build their self-esteem.
- Talk about how they might respond if someone calls them names or tries to hurt them. What could they say back? Who could they go to for help depending on the situation? Being good role models. Little eyes are always watching us! How we manage conflict in our relationships and how we treat others has a big impact

We will be kickstarting the week with a special whole school assembly which will support the children in thinking more deeply about this topic before engaging in discussions and activities back in their classrooms.
